Question: What is PYC?

Answer: PYC is Parish Youth Catechesis. It was formerly named PSR. The PYC program will be families of both St. Mary and St. John XXIII parishes. We will meet at St. John XXIII parish. The program we will be using is the Family Catechesis model. This program was used last year at St. John XXIII. The Family Catechesis program is unique in that it helps parents grow in their own faith while they guide their children in core faith formation. We will meet once a month to present information to help and support parents. Parents then catechize their children at home. Parents work with their child/ children to complete the rest of the weekly lessons at home at their own convenience before the next monthly session.

BOTTLES FOR LIFE



Nearly 50% of abortions in America are taking place with the abortion pill. In Franklin County, this rate is 80-90%. The abortion pill can now be ordered online and delivered to your home. What are some implications of taking the abortion pill? Women most frequently take the second set of abortion



pills while not sedated and in isolation within their homes. Consequently, women are experiencing post-abortion trauma symptoms, such as flashbacks/triggers depression and anxiety at a significantly more rapid rate than women who were semi-sedated in a surgical abortion. THE APPEAL 2023 UPDATE


St. John XXIII, we met our Appeal Goal! St. Mary, we are so close!

ISSUE 1 – PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Educate yourself and your circle.

<u>Issue 1 would amend our Ohio Constitution to:</u>

- Legalize taxpayer-funded abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.
- End parental involvement before children are given life-altering procedures like abortion, sterilization, or sex change surgery.
- Cut basic health and safety provisions and enable abusers.

Because this would be in our Constitution, no laws or regulations that are determined to be in conflict – whether they are in place now or considered for the future, would limit the extreme anti-life and anti-parent agenda.

Even basic health and safety provisions could be unenforceable – without passing another Constitutional Amendment.

This is just too extreme for Ohio's Constitution.

confronts our society by praying and fasting, educating ourselves and our neighbors, and making our voice heard when it's time to vote.


