MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA – EVERY MONDAY

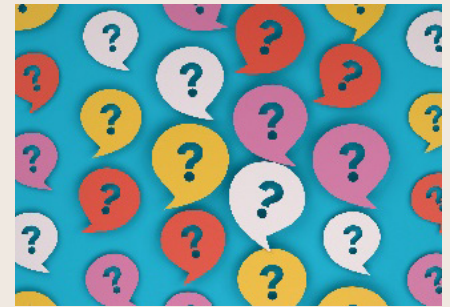
Every Monday, we will have the opportunity to gather and recite the Miraculous Medal Novena after daily Mass.

54-DAY NOVENA TO DEFEAT PROPOSED ABORTION AMENDMENT

To continue our efforts to defeat the proposed abortion amendment, Issue 1, we are asking Catholics across Ohio to unite in a 54-Day Rosary Novena, **which began on September 15, the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, through Election Day, November 7.**

ISSUE 1 – PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Educate yourself and your circle.

Issue 1 would amend our Ohio Constitution to:

- Legalize taxpayer-funded abortion through **all nine months of pregnancy.**
- **End parental involvement** before children are given life-altering procedures like abortion, sterilization, or sex change surgery.
- Cut basic health and safety provisions and **enable abusers.**

Because this would be in our Constitution, no laws or regulations that are determined to be in conflict – whether they are in place now or considered for the future, would limit the extreme anti-life and anti-parent agenda.

Even basic health and safety provisions could be unenforceable – without passing another Constitutional Amendment.

This is just too extreme for Ohio's Constitution.



The National Vietnam Memorial in Washington, D.C., is a shiny black wall that stretches 492 feet and lists the names of the 58,022 known Americans killed in that war.

If such a wall listed the names of American children killed by abortion over the past 50 years, the wall would be 60 miles long and extend from Lancaster, Ohio to Parkersburg, West Virginia. We remember the **64 million** babies in the United States who have died from abortion since Roe v. Wade went into effect over 50 years ago. In the United States, 2,700 babies are aborted per day...that is 1 baby being aborted every 30 seconds.

Monday, November 6: Mailed absentee ballots must be postmarked by this date and received by your county Board of Elections by November 13.

Tuesday, November 7, Election Day: Polls are open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. for in-person voting while absentee ballots may be personally delivered to your county Board of Elections by 7:30 p.m.

EARLY VOTING AGAINST ISSUES 1 & 2

Catholics are called to faithful citizenship, which means we must act when a moral question confronts our society by praying and fasting, educating ourselves and our neighbors, and making our voice heard when it's time to vote.

As followers of Christ, Catholics cannot be silent when the health and safety of women and preborn children are endangered by the vague language of Issue 1. We must also protect the health of children and safety of our communities, which are both threatened by the legalization of recreational marijuana proposed by Issue 2. Recreational marijuana puts children at risk by increasing exposure to harmful drugs when their development is most vulnerable. It also increases the likelihood of traffic fatalities and workplace accidents.
