DOOR REPLACEMENT CONSTRUCTION

The construction to replace and repair the entrance doors to the building of St. John XXIII Parish will start on Monday, February 12. Masses for February 12, 15 and 16 will be held at St. Mary.

Wednesday, February 14, Ash Wednesday, construction will be suspended for this day. There will be Mass at St. John XXIII at 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. as well as the Family Rosary at 5:30 p.m. and Holy Hour at 6:00 p.m. on Ash Wednesday. It will be completely safe to use the entrance during the construction period. We are choosing to hold all morning daily Masses at St. Mary to reduce the traffic flow at St. John XXII during the construction period. They will not be working into the evening, therefore we will still have any already scheduled evening events at St. John XXIII. We are working with Elford Construction, and the goal is to have the front completed before Holy week. Please pray we are able to accomplish this goal.

All Sunday Masses will be as scheduled during the duration of the construction. Again, the entrance will be secured and safe for us to enter and exit. There will not be construction on Sundays or in the evening; please attend your preferred Sunday Mass and evening parish activities as normal.
