JOIN US - DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY - 3:00 P.M.

In the Diary of St. Faustina, Jesus asked that the Feast of Divine Mercy, known today as Divine Mercy Sunday, be preceded by a Novena to The Divine Mercy. A Novena is nine days of prayer in preparation for a feast. In the case of the Novena to The Divine Mercy, we pray the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy each day for a specific intention. Our Lord told St. Faustina, "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw ... strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). The Chaplet can be said anytime, but the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a Novena. He promised, "By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls." Booklets for the Novena can be found in the Narthex. The Novena started on Good Friday, March 29th and ends on April 6th followed by the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday.

Sunday, April 7 is Divine Mercy Sunday. As a parish, we recognize this feast day with an hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, reciting the *Divine Mercy Chaplet*, Confessions are available and an ice cream sundae social following Adoration.

Adoration will start at 3:00 p.m. with the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Confessions will start following the chaplet. Adoration will continue until 4:00 p.m. After Holy Hour, join us downstairs for an ice cream sundae in the lower level at St. John XXIII. All are welcome and encouraged to attend!





PLENARY INDULGENCES

The Dominican Order is currently celebrating a Triple Jubilee in honor of St. Thomas Aquinas, remembering the 700th anniversary of his canonization (which was celebrated in July 2023), the 750th anniversary of his death (celebrated on March 7, 2024), and the 800th anniversary of his birth (which will be celebrated in 2025). In honor of these anniversaries, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a plenary indulgence to those who make a pilgrimage to a holy place connected with the Dominican Order, and there devoutly take part in the jubilee ceremonies, or at least devote a suitable time to pious recollection, concluding with the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and invocations of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of Saint Thomas Aquinas. Any church, shrine, or chapel currently entrusted to the Dominican Order can meet the requirements for the pilgrimage. In the Diocese of Columbus, St. Patrick Church in Columbus, St. Joseph Church in Somerset, and Holy Trinity Church in Somerset are entrusted to the Dominican Friars. The plenary indulgence may be obtained until January 28, 2025 under the usual conditions of Sacramental Confession 20 days before or after the indulgenced act, reception of Holy Communion, prayers for the Intentions of the Holy Father, and complete detachment from sin, including venial sin. 
